Traumatic bone cyst presenting as an asymptomatic radiolucent mandibular lesion- A case report.

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Abstract

A traumatic bone cyst (TBC) is an asymptomatic, uncommon non-neoplastic lesion of the jaws that is considered as a “pseudocyst” because of the absence of an epithelial lining. It is diagnosed during routine dental radiographic examination. Here we present a case report of a 14-year-old female patient with an accidental finding of a radiolucency in the periapical region of 45,46 & 47 on the routine radiograph. The differential diagnosis was radicular cyst, Stafney’s bone defect/cyst, aneurysmal bone cyst. The aim of the present paper is to describe the clinical, radiographic and histologic findings of traumatic bone cysts.

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
